REPORT OF FAITH GARDENS JULY 2014 MEDICAL MISSION TO CAMEROON

On July 11, 2014 Faith Gardens Medical Foundation International Inc., a US based charity organization left United States with a team of 17 healthcare providers made up of doctors, nurses, pharmacist, healthcare administrators and support staff with a mission to provide free healthcare to the people of Ngoketunjia in the North West Region of Cameroon. After being welcomed by the Prime of the Republic of Cameroon, H. E. Mr. Philemon Yang on July 14, 2014, the Team left for Ndop Center and Hope Solidarity Medical Center at Bangolan in Babessi Subdivision in Ngoketunjia Division where they provided free medical services. This consisted of general consultations, offering medications, distributing prescription eye glasses and providing health information and education. The Team departed the NW Region of Cameroon on July 18, 2014 after visiting Governor Adolhpe Lele Lafrique Deben Tchoffo of the NW and Shisong Cardiac Center. The first team left Cameroon on July 19 while the remaining team members provided free care in Yaounde at Quality Healthcare Clinic on July 21, 2014. The mission trip ended with a visit at the National Assembly during which the President of Faith Gardens was received by Questor Honorable Njingum Musa. July 2014 will remain memorable in the history of Faith Gardens.

REPORT OF FAITH GARDENS JULY 2014 MEDICAL MISSION TO CAMEROON

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF FAITH GARDENS MEDICAL FOUNDATION INTERNATIONAL INC. MEETING DURING THE ANNUAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING IN DECEMBER 2013 APPROVED THAT THE PRESIDENT AND THE EXECUTIVE CHAIR OF FAITH GARDENS, SAMUEL K NDINJIAKAT, RCIS, MSPAS, PA-C, MSCPM/MBA LEADS A MEDICAL MISSION TEAM TO CAMEROON. THE FAITH GARDENS JULY 2014 MEDICAL MISSION TEAM MADE UP OF 17 PEOPLE DEPARTED FROM THE UNITED STATES ON JULY 11, 2014 AND RETURNED ON JULY 26, 2014. THE MEDICAL MISSION TRIP WAS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MISSION AND VISION OF THE ORGANIZATION WHICH STATE:

Mission:

Make a Difference in the Lives of those who are in need of quality, accessible and affordable healthcare by philanthropically providing financial support, medical equipment, medical supplies, continue medical education and health leadership training to Grace Gardens Medical Center in Cameroon – Africa and its affiliates elsewhere.

Vision:

- **Because the treatment of infectious and chronic diseases in the less privileged and medically underserved is our passion for life, we are committed to be the Leader in building healthiest communities.**
- **Faith Gardens is committed to sow, nurture and be the place of “Grace” which freely gives and receives.**

Upon the invitation and with the assistance of the Prime Minister, Head of Government of the Republic of Cameroon H. E. Mr. Philemon Yang, Dr. Henry Tatangang, Advisory Committee Chair, Senator Ignatius Dingha of Royal Garden Hotel, Dr. Nick Ngwanyam of St Louis Group, Rev Donald Ndichafah, Rev/Dr. Charlemagne Nditemeh, Questor Honorable Njingum Musa, Alternate Senator His Royal Highness Fon Chafah XI, Mayor Abel Chenyi of Ndop and District Medical Officer of Ndop Dr. Emmanuel Bambo, Dr. Emmanuel Tatapong of Hope Solidarity NGO, Dr. Judith Shang of Quality Health Care Unit and the entire members of the Task Force including all the volunteers; Faith Gardens organized a medical campaign titled “Rebuilding hope through preventive health care” from July 12 to July 25, 2014 in Ndop Center and Bangolan – Babessi Sub Division all in Ngoketunjia Division of the North West Region. The Medical Campaign ended at Quality Health Care Unit operated by Shemka Foundation at NKolbison in Yaounde.

The 17 members of Faith Gardens Medical Team were assisted by 23 volunteers in Ndop Center, A team of Medical personnel and staff of Hope Solidarity Medical Center in Bangolan and at Quality Health Care Unit at Nkolbison in Yaounde. The crew rendered services such as general/specialized consultations, offering of medications, distributing prescription eye glasses, and providing

information and education to a total of 1753 patients (450 in Ndop Center on July 15, 1050 in Bangolan on July 16 and 17, and 253 at Quality Health Care Unit in Yaounde on July 21).

Arrival of the Team into Cameroon via Yaounde – Nsimalen International Airport:

The Team arrived Yaounde – Nsimalen International Airport at 11:50 pm on July 12 and went through Custom without delay thanks to customs duty exoneration issued by the Minister of Finance via the Prime Minister. It is also worth noting that an officer by name Principal Inspector Kah Ndasi was very kind to collect all the Passports and facilitated the stamping. Mr. Godfred Foryang of the Prime Minister’s office was present to welcome the Team. The Task Force was represented by Rev/Dr. Charlemagne Nditemeh who escorted the team to the rest house at Mvolie (CICM) and prayed asking God to protect and lead the Team during their stay in Cameroon.

As the team settled down in the early morning of July 13, around 3 am, news came that one of the team members; Danielle Ndi was involved in an accident. Thank God she did not sustain any injury even though her uncle was severely injured. The President of Faith Gardens rushed to Central Hospital in Yaounde where he provided assistance.

Sunday Worship Service at Faith Baptist Church Anguissa in Yaounde on July 13, 2014:

The team left for church service at Faith Baptist Church Anguissa at 08:00 am where members attended services both in English and in French. One of the team members Mrs. Emelda Ndinjiakat, Treasurer of Faith Gardens had the opportunity to sing with her old singing group in front of the congregation. The President of Faith Gardens was given an opportunity to introduce the team to the Christians of Faith Baptist Church. He stated that their mission will take them to Ngoketunjia Division where they will provide free medical care. The Team was given light refreshment before the visit to Hope Services where Rev Ndichafah showed them around the premises. Dr. Tatapong of Hope Solidarity and Rev Ndichafah ushered the team to Restaurant for lunch. The Team returned back to Rest House at Mvolie at 5 pm.

AUDIENCE WITH THE PRIME MINISTER OF THE REPUBLIC OF CAMEROON:

The Team arrived the “Star Building” which is the Prime Minister’s office of Cameroon at 08:00 am and was escorted to the Lobby by the security team. The Director of Cabinet at the Prime Minister’s office, Professor Paul Ghogomu escorted the Team to the Conference room where the Team was received by H. E. Prime Minister Philemon Yang. The Prime Minister welcomed the Team and gave the floor to the President of Faith Gardens who then thanked the Prime Minister for warm hospitality. He also informed the PM that the Team arrived safely at the rest house from the airport with no delay. After explaining that Faith Gardens Medical Foundation Inc., is a federally incorporated Charitable organization which is tax exempt under section 501(c)3 of IRS in the USA; he went on to state the mission of Faith Gardens as follows: “Make a Difference in the Lives of those who are in need of quality, accessible and affordable healthcare by philanthropically providing financial support, medical equipment, medical supplies, continue medical education and health leadership training through Grace Gardens University Medical Center and its affiliates elsewhere; whose construction is envisaged in Ndop, a project for which we seek your support (Of the Prime Minister) as we prepare the file through the appropriate channel”.

The Prime Minister played a role of a mentor to the Team. He briefed the team about Cameroon especially healthcare in Cameroon. He was very pleased of the initiative by Faith Gardens to lead a free medical campaign to Cameroon. He recommended certain health units in the North West Regions for the Team to visit and cautioned the Team on what to eat while in Cameroon. He proudly introduced the Team to the numerous foods and fruits especially the staple food of the North West Region “Fufu”. Concerning the creation of a hospital, the Prime Minister advised Faith Gardens on what it will take to obtain authorization for a hospital and that he will be the first to come inaugurate the center. He advised that the word university be taken out of the name Grace Gardens University Medical Center to “Grace Gardens Medical Center”: a piece of advice that did not fall in deaf ears.

Meet the Press:

The team arrived Hope Solidarity NGO Head office in Essos, Yaounde where they were welcomed by the President and CEO of Hope Solidarity NGO, Dr. Emmanuel Tatapong. He gave the Team a tour of the Head office. The long wait and tedious journey started at this juncture as the Team waited for the Journalists. Hope Solidarity provided some light refreshment to the team. The Press conference finally started one hour late at 11 am during which Dr. Tatapong officially welcome Faith Gardens. He enlightened the public on the creation, objectives and activities of Hope Solidarity NGO giving detailed account of the achievements registered in other communities by the Hope Solidarity humanitarian crew in partnership with the Embassy of Israel. The President of Faith Gardens thanked Hope Solidarity for accepting to host the medical campaign in Bangolan. He also educated the public on the mission, vision of Faith Gardens and plans to open a Health Center in Ndop. His reason to choose Ndop was very simple; that is where he was born. He received a thunderous applause from the crowd when he stated that if all the sons and daughters of Cameroon in Diaspora were to come home and do something in their native birth town, Cameroon will develop. He answered questions from the media among which was the question on the total cost of Medications and medical supplies. Per the Gift certificates and the invoices provided by donors, the President of Faith Gardens stated that the total cost was \$65000, about 3,250,000 FCFA. He commended his American Team members for accepting to be part of this Maiden Medical Mission. He thanked them for paying for their own flight tickets, hotel bills and transportation

in order to make a difference in the life of those in need of quality health care. The press conference ended with a thank you note and a message from Vice President of Hope Solidarity NGO, Dr. /Colonel Weriwoh. He also made it clear to the Press that Faith Gardens did not give any money to Hope Solidarity and that the Local leaders and Traditional leaders should stop asking money from humanitarian teams when they come to help them.

The Team, after eating late lunch at Bastos in Yaounde was escorted to Bamenda by Dr. Nick Ngwanyam of St Louis Group. The Team arrived Bamenda Upstation at Midnight and was received by Dr. & Mrs. Ngwanyam at their Residence. Mrs. Ngwanyam served the Team with a very delicious meal which everybody enjoyed. For security and safety reasons, Dr. Ngwanyam recommended that the Team should stay the night in Bamenda and only go down to Ndop in the morning. He made arrangements with the Manager of Mawa Hotel who quickly took the Team to the hotel. It was really a good idea for the team to stay in a nice hotel, refresh before embarking on a tough road ahead.

Free Medical Campaign on Tuesday July 15 in Ndop:

The team arrived Ndop at 08:00 am and went straight to Royal Garden Hotel where the medications and medical supplies were sorted. The President of Faith Gardens met with the Security Council of Ngoketunjia chaired by the Senior Divisional Officer. After deliberation and sub meetings, the District Medical officer of Ndop Dr. Emmanuel Ngala Bambo presented to the Security Council in the following statements: “I have carried out the required technical investigation and found that they are an NGO with humanitarian interest to help the poor in offering free medical services to the underprivileged. They have qualified medical personnel, good quality essential drug as per attached lists. I append my approval for you granting them authorization to carry out their activities under the supervision of the district health service of Ngoketunjia”.

The District Medical Officer (DMO) and the Mayor escorted the President to Ndop Community Hall to meet the Team where a huge crowd has been waiting since 7 am. The opening Ceremony started at noon during which Mayor Abel Chenyi of Ndop Center welcomed the Team and thanked them for coming to Ndop. The DMO addressed the crowd and assured them that the Team from the USA consisted of qualified medical doctors and explained the practical reasons for the delay in starting and hoped that the next Medical Mission trip will start on time. The president of Faith Gardens thanked the Senior Divisional Officer, the Divisional Officer, the Mayor, the DMO and the other Leaders of the locality for the warm reception. He received a loud applause from the crowd when he said that he was from Ndop and has come back home to give back. He again told the people of Ndop that Faith Gardens has come to stay and that Faith Gardens will build a medical center at Mbiyeh in Ndop Center.

Day one of Clinical Practice July 15, 2014:

After the ceremony, the community hall was turned into a clinic. One of the rooms was used as a triage and vital room. After triage, patients were separated into Non-urgent and Urgent categories. The four providers saw patients and prescriptions were sent to the pharmacist who was assisted by many volunteers in counting the medications. Each prescription was properly labeled with the name of medication, dose of medication based on weight and how often to take it. The patients were also made aware of the side effects of every medication by both the Pharmacist and the Doctors. The instructions were given by our experienced Pharmacist Marilyn Shang Simo. Each patient came with their medical book which was assigned a number before being sent for vital signs. Crowd control was headed by Mr. Gerald Chenyi, Financial Secretary of Faith Gardens. Mayor Abel Chenyi and his assistants were around talking to the people and assuring them that they will all receive care. In an effort to attend to every patient, the free medical campaign in Ndop went into the night and closed at 9:30 pm.

Recurrent cases of skin infections, arthritis, hypertension, typhoid, malaria, acid reflux, sexually transmitted diseases, dental illnesses, few lipoma, generalized body pains, headache, insomnia, and diabetes were clinically diagnosed. The laboratory tests carried were urinalysis and blood glucose level using test strips. Eye problems were referred to Bangolan where glasses were to be distributed after being consulted by Ophthalmologist.

The general public benefited from information, education and communication on disease prevention, life style changes and on medication safety and polypharmacy. A total 450 patients received general

consultations and were provided free medications. The team returned to their base at Royal Garden Hotel at 10:30 pm.

Day two of Clinical Practice, July 16, 2014:

The Team left Royal Garden Hotel for Bangolan at 7:30 am. Bangolan is about 85 Km from Bamenda town and is situated 15 km south of Babessi Subdivision in Ngoketunjia, North West Region of Cameroon. This village per His Royal Highness Fon Chafah XI of Bangolan is made up of about 25000 people who generally practice agriculture, animal rearing and fishing. The staple cash crop is rice and the main food crop is maize. Bangolan has Baptist integrated health center and two private clinics including Hope Solidarity Medical Center where Faith Gardens and Hope Solidarity NGO saw patients on days two and three of the Medical Mission.

The Team arrived Bangolan Palace at 08:30 am and was warmly received by His Royal Highness Fon Chafah XI, Fon of Bangolan. The Palace yard was lined by Traditional dance Group who sang joyfully as the team was escorted to the Palace. His Royal Highness the Fon ushered the Team to a special breakfast during which the Queen Mother, mother of the Fon of Bangolan joined the Team. Both the Queen Mother and His Royal Highness the Fon thanked the team for the initiative and asked God to bless the team.

His Royal Highness the Fon escorted the Team to Hope Solidarity Medical Center at Makulung where he presided over the opening ceremony.

The opening ceremony started with the singing of the National Anthem of Cameroon by the pupils from Bangolan Promise Center (BPC). Right after that a word of prayer was offered followed by speeches from Assistant Mayor of Babessi, Mr. Samuel Ndueh, CEO of Hope Solidarity Dr. Tatapong, Vice President of Hope Solidarity NGO Dr. /Col Weriwoh, His Royal Highness Fon Chafah XI and the President of Faith Gardens. Dr. Tatapong read a speech which included objectives, mission and vision of Hope Solidarity as already stated above. His Royal Highness the Fon of Bangolan welcomed his son, Dr. Samuel Ndinjiakat home and received a thunderous applause from the crowd. His Royal Highness stated that others should follow his example and using the old adage that “Sam” fishes but brings it home and shares with the family. He blessed Dr. Samuel Ndinjiakat, his wife Emelda and two children; Samuel Jr. and Princess. He also blessed Dr. Tatapong for his hard work and humanitarian efforts. The President of Faith Gardens received a heroic applause from the crowd when he addressed the people and told them of his plans to open a medical center at Ndop. He thanked His Royal Highness the Fon, Dr. Tatapong, his Mom and the people of Bangolan for the upbringing and education he benefited from them when he was a child. He came back home because God has blessed him and he wants to give back. His Royal Highness the Fon was the first distinguished patient to be consulted by the Ophthalmologist.

The crowd in Bangolan was difficult to control because of two competing systems. Proper introduction of both staff of Hope Solidarity and that of Faith Gardens was not done due to the late start. The medical staff of Hope Solidarity started consulting patients and was using their clinic formulary which posed problems to the Faith Gardens Pharmacist. Faith Gardens quickly addressed the situation by providing a formulary to the Medical staff of Hope Solidarity.

About 200 patients from Ndop not consulted followed the Team to Bangolan. The Mayor of Ndop provided transportation assistance for them to get to Bangolan. After resolving practical issues, the teams settled down to business and by 8pm, the Hope Solidarity Team and that of Faith Gardens have consulted and treated 500

patients. The disease conditions were similar to those in Ndop: skin infections, high blood pressure, malaria, arthritis and so on. The Team had dinner at Dr. Tatapong's residence before returning to base in Ndop at 10:00 pm.

Day Three of Clinical Practice, July 17, 2014:

The day started at 07:30 am with a stop at the future site of the Grace Gardens Medical Center at Mbiyeh in Ndop. This is where Faith Gardens will build a medical center to better fulfill the mission of making a difference in the lives of those in need of quality, accessible and affordable healthcare.

The Team then left for Bangolan for the last day of the free medical care where the population was just as many as the previous day. Those who were not consulted the previous day were attended to first before attending to new patients. The Team provided medical care on this day to close to 500 patients. Pain medications, anti-inflammatory, antihypertensive (Nifedipine, HCT and Lisinopril) and antifungal were the most prescribed.

Meeting with the Governor of the North West Region on July 18, 2014:



The President of Faith Gardens led a Delegation accompanied by Senator Ignatius Dingha and Dr. Nick Ngwanyam to the office of the Governor of North West Region. Senator Dingha Ignatius of Ngoketunja introduced the President of Faith Gardens and gave a brief summary of the Medical Mission in his jurisdiction. Governor Lele Lafrique welcomed the Team and thanked the Group for such an impressive initiative. Responding to the President of Faith Gardens concerning the opening of a medical center in Ndop, the Governor told the Team to count on his support. He said that it is really a privilege to see the son of the soil come back to give back by helping his own people. He went on to state that his name and pictures are on many social media for supporting projects which have no social benefits and he has not been happy with those misusing his title. “Building a hospital is a thing to do and will help everybody”, he stated. Meeting ended at 10:00 am and the delegation joined the rest of the Team at Royal Garden Hotel before leaving for Shisong Cardiac Center in Bui Division for a working visit.

The Staff of Quality Healthcare and Faith Gardens Medical Mission Team were invited by Professor Julius Oben at his Residence in Nkolmesseng for a special dinner during which the President of Faith Gardens thanked all the Team members for their hard work and asked God to bless Professor Oben and family for their kind hospitality. He also acknowledged the support given by Dr. Judith Shang and Ms Gladys Shang throughout their stay in Cameroon. Professor Oben was pleased to have the team members and also the staff of Quality Healthcare at his Residence. The Medical Coordinator for 2014 Mission NP Nelia Soares thanked everybody for their hard work and also appreciated Professor Oben for the special dinner.
